TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

The trustees of the charity, present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2016.

Objects of the Charity

The object of the charity is to promote Scouting in the West Herts area by providing the structure that enables the eight individual Scout Groups to operate efficiently. The charity provides recruitment, training and some District scouting activities.

Public benefit

In planning activities for the year, the West Herts Exec confirm that they have given due regard to the Charity Commission's legislative and regularity requirements to comply with Section 17 of the Charities Act 2011. This report outlines how our achievements during the year have benefited the public.

Summary of Financial Position for the Financial Year 16/17, and as at 31st March, 2017

The separate Accounts Document – prepared to current reporting standards for charities, and examined by out Independent Examiner – show the formal accounts for the financial year, and the Balance Sheet as at the end of that year. These accounts include the activities of the District Council, including Capitation received and paid, District Expenses (including Insurance) and District Activities and Trading (including Marine, Badges, Lochearnhead, St George's Day, Remembrance Sunday and District events). They also include the accounts for the four Explorer Units (Crong, Icknield, Oddy and Thunderdell), but exclude the accounts for the eight Scout Groups, which are charities in their own right and report separately to County and to the Charity Commission.

Principal Activities this Year

Our ambition continues to be "bring quality scouting to as many young people as possible". This has proved difficult in 2016-17 owing to the difficulty in recruiting adult volunteers. All of our Groups and sections are operating at full capacity and have waiting lists.

The Scout District exists to give structure to local Scouting and to provide a link to the County and by extension the National (and International) Scouting Organisations. The District Commissioner leads the uniformed membership and the District Chairman and District Treasurer lead the non-uniformed (but still vital) lay membership.

The District Exec meets regularly throughout the year to review the activities of the Groups and the District.

The District is responsible for

- Vetting all applicants for adult leadership roles (through the AAC)
- Collection and remittance of the annual membership subscription to the County
- Completion of the annual census
- Dealing with safeguarding issues as they occur
- Supporting the Groups and District sections (Explorers, Network and SAS)
- Organising District events
- Administering the District training fund (through a sub-committee)
- Providing finance to individuals and Groups to enable them to expand access to Scouting
- Protecting District assets

The Executive has been active this year in all of the above areas.

During 2017 the District replaced the District website with a new site that is professionally managed and therefore always up to date and using the latest brand identities from the Scout Association. The address of the new website is www.westherts.scoutsonline.co.uk

Impact Benefit Statement

Through the Scout Groups and the District Units (Explorers and Network) West Herts District delivers Scouting to 743 young people. To do this requires the commitment, in various roles of 195 adult volunteers making a total District membership of 938. 134 of the young person's being Explorers or Network are directly managed by the District by the District Explorer Scout Leaders and the Network Leaders.

The District team ran/and or participated in a number of events during the year. Highlights included

- COBS (Cooking, Orienteering, Bivouac and Survival)
- Scout Cooking Competition
- A St George's Day celebration at Phasels Wood
- A variety of DofE Bronze and Silver practice and real expeditions
- District participation in Green Beret, Peak Assault, Chiltern Challenge and other competitions
- Member participation in County organised events; Cubs 100, Beavers in Tents, Cyclocross, Cub County Night Hike, Explorer Belt Expedition to Croatia and the Mersey Sailing Week

The individual Groups carry out activities on a weekly basis too numerous to mention here. They are all designed by the individual Leaders to deliver the Scouting programme to the age range on which they are focussed.

The District is constantly looking at ways of funding improvements to our facilities and the training of our adult members. In this year the District has funded

- Concrete bases for District equipment stores
- Kayak training
- REC 2 first aid training
- Activity permit training
- Leader refreshments during training days
- New lightweight camping equipment for Thunderdell ESU

The District administers an 'access for all fund'. The funding is provided by the Rotary Club of Berkhamsted and Bulbourne and the fund is used to pay grants to families and individuals to enable them to take part in Scouting activities that would otherwise be too expensive.

Our work to expand Scouting is hampered by a lack of adult volunteers. We have the facilities and the 'spare' evenings which would enable the setting up of a number of extra sections. We have the young people already on waiting lists ready to join. What we do not have is the adults to lead them. The focus for 2017-18 must be on recruiting more adult leaders.

Risk management

The major risks to which the charity is exposed, as identified by the trustees, have been reviewed and systems or procedures have been established to manage those risks.

The District is without a DC as the current DC stood down (at the end of his term) in September 2016. To enable a reasonable succession plan to be put in place, the retiring DC agreed to continue to serve in the interim until a replacement was found. The District understands that a name has been suggested to County. The fact is that no appointment has been made and therefore the District remain officially leaderless.

Recruitment and induction of trustees

Trustees are selected on the basis of their expertise, skills and knowledge and upon the benefits that these can bring to the charity. New trustees are briefed on the activities of the charity by other trustees: their attention is drawn in particular to their legal obligations under Charity Law and the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

Charity and company law require the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law) which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and its financial activities for that period. In preparing those financial statements the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting practices and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business;
- observe the methods and principles of the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice; and
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.

The trustees are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Charities Law. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Disclosure of information to the independent examiner
