# OS Map-sign Bingo

A game for all ages.

Provides for 18 scouts to play but this can be increased by duplicating cards. Duplication will create the possibility of multiple winners, but this hardly matters in this game.

Purpose is to commit Ordnance Survey map symbols to memory to increase skill in map reading.

Played like conventional bingo, a leader randomly pulls a named card out of a box and announces what it is to the scouts. Each scout has a bingo card with several random map symbols and a small pile of covers. Scouts cover all symbols that are announced and the first to cover every symbol on the card is the winner. The leader places all the cards in front of him/her to help with questions or disputes. Prizes are optional.

Bingo cards are swapped around and the game starts again.

Scouts (or beavers, cubs, explorers or leaders) should have a few minutes with an OS map or the training sheets to familiarise themselves with the symbols before the bingo game begins.

### This resource pack contains:

18 different bingo cards(12 symbols on each).

Training sheets that show the OS symbols.

Calling cards that show the symbols and their meanings.


A sheet of cover cards. 3 sheets required to make enough covers. (3 prints of page 14).

To get the best results, print in full colour on light white card or spray-mount quality paper prints onto card. For a good finish, cut out the cards with steel ruler and scalpel/ craft knife. Scissors need extra patience to achieve good edges but with care will achieve good results.

When the game is over, collect all the pieces and put them away in a labelled envelope for another time.


